Our Mission

Fort Indiantown Gap is an Army National Guard maneuver training installation, one of only a handful across the U.S. The installation supports training for Active Duty, Reserve, and National Guard Soldiers and Airmen, as well as service members from other branches of service. Units come here to use the ranges and training grounds in preparation for their wartime mission. Additionally, the installation has been designated a FEMA point of distribution and operates the Pennsylvania National Guard's emergency operation center during state emergencies.

Facilities

Fort Indiantown Gap is home to many training sites. Weapon ranges include small arms, sniper, crew-served, anti-tank, indirect fire (artillery), aerial gunnery, and air-to-ground bombing sites.


Urban training sites include a 1 km simulated town, forward operating base, 2.5 mile IED training road, structure collapse site, live fire shoot house, and urban assault course.

Virtual training sites include aviation trainers, dismounted soldier training, a truck trainer, and simulated weapons trainers.


Other training sites include leadership reaction courses, land navigation courses, and a variety of training areas that may be customized to meet unit training needs.

Support and recreation facilities include dining facilities, barracks, temporary lodging, medical facilities, a gym, pool, mini-PX, Subway, community club, and USO. The installation also supports an active hunting and fishing club, as well as canoeing and other outdoor recreation facilities.
